


Multi Domain Environment

The first domain that is created is referred to as the "root domain" and is at the top of the directory tree. All subsequent domains will live beneath the root domain and are referred to as child domains. The child domain names must be unique.




Activate Windows

Go to Action Center to activate Windows.

You can see that the structure begins to take the shape of a tree with branches and sub-branches.



Lets suppose that the company owns several other corporations. Typically, each company would have its own tree and these would be aggregated together via trusts to create a "forest". Let's look at an example below



So let's say that our company owns `techtutorials.net` (actually that is true) and `xyzabc`. You can see that the individual trees are organized just like the root domain (`mcmcse`).
